The Town of Bermuda Run Government Offices are open Monday - Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.




Your Town Council

"I love coming home on Friday evening and not leaving the community until Monday morning! We have so many amenities that bring families outdoors. like the Blue Heron Trail."


What Heather would like to see accomplished: "I support the Ignite Davie program, and any other program that promotes workforce education."

COMET NO OPE

The first phase of Comet Bermuda Run within the Kinderton development on Kinderton Way will be receiving new residents as of January.

When complete, Comet will features 224 luxury apartment homes with a variety of one- and two-bedroom floorplans and 27 electric vehicle charging-equipped garages on a nicely landscaped property.

Apartment amenities include smartphonecontrolled locks and thermostats, open kitchen concepts with stainless steel appliances, tiled backsplashes, solid wood cabinetry, and granite countertops, premium flooring in a mix of concrete, carpet, and wood-style flooring options and more.

Community amenities include a fitness center, yoga room, package delivery lockers, Wifi, self-serve Java and beer taps, billiards table, resort-style pool with lap lane, ping pong table, outdoor grilling station, fire pit lounge,

dog park, and car wash center.

The management company's "Hometown Leader" program offers incentives for teachers, firefighters, law enforcement, nurses and military

renters. The Comet office is open, and the first building will begin having residents move in throughout the month of January.


