## Message from Mayor Mike Brannon

As I travel our Town, it is clear that spring has arrived with blooming tulips, blossoming trees and the annual dusting of pollen that covers our newly washed vehicles! Regardless, it is still

great that our temperatures are warming and many of us will be spending more time outdoors enjoying the beauty throughout the communities of our Town.

It was an honor once again this year to participate in the Opening Ceremony of our 32nd Davie County Senior Games at RISE Indoor Sports. Whether you are participating in one or more of these sporting events or simply watching our seniors play in the many events being held across our county, I want to again thank Davie County Senior Services for their work to coordinate these games. As I noted in last month's message, we were able to open our second phase of

the Blue Heron Trail which included the long-awaited opening of the I-40 pedestrian bridge. As I mentioned in my remarks at the ribbon cutting ceremony, the Town leaders of today owe a huge thanks to previous Town leaders who helped create the vision that made that project a success.

## Golf Cart Safety - Reminder from our Community Officer

With warmer weather, more people are getting outside. Often, Bermuda Run residents drive their personal golf carts when going place to place.

It is important to keep safety in mind when driving a golf cart. Over 13,000 golf cart-related accidents occur annually that require emergency room visits.



Some of those accidents result in fatalities. Over 40% of those accidents involve underage drivers (under age 16). By law, in North Carolina, the driver of a golf cart on a public road must also be a licensed driver.

All roads in the town, including the neighborhoods of Bermuda Run, Bermuda Run West, and Kinderton Village are subject to these laws. Please be mindful of this as we patrol throughout our neighborhoods. We all want our residents to have an enjoyable and safe spring and summer.

With the addition of the Blue Heron Trail, it is important to remember that golf carts and other motorized vehicles are not allowed on the trail for the safety of others. Also, it is the responsibility of both the walkers/runners/bikers, and vehicle drivers to look both ways at crosswalks.
